Physics Students droppin' Eggs

CDC modifies recommendations

Quarantine recommendations have changed recently. A person required to quarantine, rather than having a full 14 days of quarantine, has an alternative: They can quarantine through day seven, and may return to school on the 8th day after the date of exposure, as long as they had a negative COVID test in the last three days of the quarantine, and they will also be given a rapid test on day 10. They must return to complete the quarantine if they develop symptoms anytime through day 14. To return on day 8—two tests must be taken.

If the person is quarantined through day 10, they must have a negative test on day 10 or the morning of day 11, upon their return to school.

Mask rules haven't changed, nor have the rules for people who test positive. The letter explaining the changes and how they affect the school is available on the school website, or people can contact the school for further explanation.

The 2020-2021 wrestling season got off to a rocky start with a duel against Winner on December 4. Parkston was taking on the number two team in the state with 11 of 14 starting spots ranked in the preseason rankings. There were three JV matches and the Varsity started at the 113 weight class. There was one forfeit and one win from a pin fall: Porter Neugebauer over Jude Sargent. The final score was 69-12. This was the first duel for the new head coach Dan Bonte. Bonte was a 4-time state champion wrestler for Garretson.

On December 10, there was a round robin between Parkston, Madison, Sioux Falls Lincoln, and Webster Area. Noah Mahoney, Logan Heidinger, Kolter Kramer, Gage Reichert, Gavin Braun, Wyatt Anderson, Kaden Holzbauer, Zack VanZee and Landon Sudbeck all took first place in their weight classes. Porter Neugebauer, Riley Neugebauer, and Gage Jodozi placed second; Gabe Neugebauer, Kash Neugebauer, and Carter Sommers placed third; Four wrestlers placed fourth--TJ Schmidt, Javon Kniffen, Breckin Culbert, and Aaron Baumiller.

On December 12 the Parkston team went to Howard for the Ken Ruml Invitational Tournament. The team finished 4th with 96.5 points. Top finishers include: Gavin Braun(106)--1st place; Wyatt Anderson(113) got 1st place; Carter Sommers(120) 4th; Porter Neugebauer(126) 1st; Noah Mahoney(160) got 2nd, and Brock Tuttle(195) 4th.
